President's Message

United Methodist Women at Work in Tanzania

In mid-August I was a team member of Bishop David Graves' Exploratory Trip to Tanzania. When we were in Dar es Salaam for a conference, I asked to meet with the leader of the United Methodist Women (United Women in Faith). I was introduced to Kabaka Ndala Alphonsine, who, it turns out, is the Women's Missionary Coordinator for the Global Ministries Project, Tanzania Women Development, Orphans and Vulnerable Children Schools.

Katy Wrona and I met briefly with Kabaka. She shared a little about her work travelling to different churches and rural areas to train and educate local women, girls and children. She has a small team that travels with her to teach in areas vital to the health and well-being of the women and children.

From the United Methodist Church Global Ministries website, I learned that the physical, spiritual and health issues that the women, girls and children face are a result of poverty. Kabaka and her team seek to provide physical, spiritual and material assistance for this vulnerable group. They also provide seminars and organizational meetings at all levels, from local groups to conference level groups.

While not officially affiliated with United Women in Faith, Kabaka and her team are still United Methodist Women working in their communities to bring resources and training to women, girls and children. St. Luke United Women in Faith had a booth at the "Spring Festival of Flowers" which is held every year in Milton, Florida.






We raised over \$3,000 dollars. Member, Betty Salter, grew many hundreds of plants in her greenhouse and other members and friends donated as well. Our United Women in Faith unit was able to increase donations to many local and global charities.

Brittany Barnett is someone you will want to get to know about.

I first heard Brittany Barnett on a UWFaith, Faith Talk podcast, July 18, 2021, when she was interviewed by Jennifer R. Farmer. The subject was "When Mom's in Prison." Her mom had been in prison and she founded a program "Girls Embracing Mothers (GEM)." GEM is dedicated to breaking the cycle of incarceration for daughters of incarcerated mothers. Its programs strengthen the relationships between young daughters and incarcerated mothers and offers reentry-based training for mothers. GEM has been awarded a \$250,000 UWFaith grant (see response, Nov-Dec 2022.)



GEM is just one part of Brittany's story. You will want to read her memoir, A Knock at Midnight: A Story of Hope, Justice and Freedom, CROWN (2021). It is on the 2023 UWFaith Reading Program list. It describes her growing up years, her life as a successful accountant and then as

a corporate lawyer. She worked at night pro bono to free victims of America's war on drugs who are in near hopeless legal battles having been unfairly incarcerated for minor, non-violent crimes.
