The Trinity UMW of Ft. Walton Beach, Berta Jones Circle: Human Trafficking

The Trinity UMW of Ft. Walton Beach, Berta Jones Circle welcomed, Skip Orth, the Chairman of the Faith Based, Non-Profit Organization, **Refuge for Women**, **Emerald Coast**. Skip gave a very informative talk on the tragedy of Human Trafficking calling it "**not just a third world problem**". "Human Trafficking is a systematic abuse being perpetrated on a specific group of vulnerable individuals in our country." Skip wrote a book concerning this unimaginable social issue called: "Refuge for Women: If I could talk to you about Human Trafficking, this is what I would say..." His goal is to open a Faith Based safe house on the Emerald Coast, where shelter, counseling, substance abuse recovery, job training and mentoring is provided for women who have escaped the sex industry. To date, Refuge For Women has a 94% success rate from those graduating from their program and have not returned to the sex industry or substance abuse.
