2021 Dothan District Pledge to Mission Received \$5,067 (42%)

Can you believe we are almost half way through 2021? Last May, we were trying to find ways to connect and continue our work as United Methodist Women. This year, we are able to look around and see that not even a pandemic could stop United Methodist Women. We have persevered despite not being able to meet inperson.

The connections we make through this organization are more than just a casual connection. We are bound together through our desire to help women, children, and youth. This desire runs through all of us and makes us refuse to give up. We know that there are still women, children, and youth that need our help, and we are determined to give it.

Although most units have not been meeting in person, that has not stopped your generosity. This year, you have given a total of \$5,067.25 in Five-Star Funds (Pledge to Mission, Gift to Mission, Gift in Memory, Special Mission Recognition pins, and World Thank Offering), \$1,105 for Call to Prayer and Self Denial, and \$984 in other designated gifts. That is a total of \$7,156.25!

Hopefully, we will soon be able to resume our regular (IN-PERSON) meetings. I have missed my circle and have definitely missed seeing all of you. Our next district meeting is District Spiritual Day on August 14. Right now, it is scheduled to be a Zoom meeting, but I would love to change it to an in-person meeting. Spiritual Growth: Praying is the Answer

Likewise the Spirit helps us with our weakness; for we do not know how to pray as we ought, but that very Spirit intercedes with sighs too deep for words. Romans 8:26

As United Methodists, we know that our prayers are enabled by the Holy Spirit. Prayer is vital to faithful worship, and many ways of praying are found in our Methodist heritage. John Wesley encouraged both formal, written prayers and free, spontaneous prayers.

Prayer is an integral part of worship. It is also an integral part of our daily life and should be a daily focus for all of us. Prayer is unique for each person. You get to choose where and how you pray. Your prayers are about you and your life. They are part of your personal relationship with God.

I enjoy looking at the United Methodist Book of Worship (1992). Taking time to go through it has been a rewarding experience for me. Please put this on your 'to do' list. I think you will find it to be very rewarding.

May is Mental Health Month

In 1949, May was designated as Mental Health month. The facts about mental health are staggering. Consider the following statistics from the National Council for Mental Wellbeing

- 1 in 5 U.S. adults experience mental issues each year
- 1 in 20 U.S. adults experience serious metal illness each year
- 1 in 6 U.S. youth aged 6-17 experience a mental health disorder each year
- 50% of all lifetime mental illness begins by age 14, and 75% by age 24
- Suicide is the second leading cause of death among people aged 10-34

The reality is, many people try walking through mental health struggles alone, without the support of family, friends, mental health professions, and support groups. No one has to walk through these struggles alone. NAMI (National Alliance on Mental Illness), Mental Health America, and the National Council for Mental Wellbeing are some places that you can get more information.

What can we as United Methodist Women do to help? We can pray for those that are disenfranchised; we can support the efforts of women, children, and youth who struggle with mental health conditions; we can speak out about mental health; we can support legislative actions which will benefit people who are struggling with mental health issues; and we can treat each other with respect, understanding, and love. Our Mission u study, *Finding Peace in an Anxious World*, is an excellent place to start looking for ways you can help.
